
Saturday, May 9, 2:00 PM - 3:00 PM (First-Floor)



Genealogical Society of Broward County Program Monthly Meeting

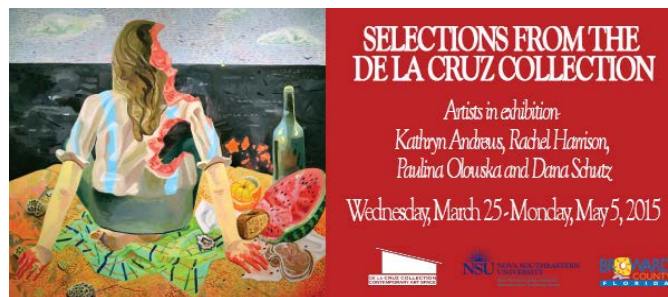
