Log on to Heritage Quest

The Alvin Sherman Library has a new resource that uses technology to assist in tracing family history. HeritageQuest Online™, a web-based reference tool from ProQuest Information and Learning, allows you to start exploring your roots by searching a surname. Come to the Alvin Sherman library and access this database through the library website and begin instantly searching the database's millions of records for clues to their past – as far back as the 1700s. Once connected to HeritageQuest Online, users will find several paths to finding information – the U.S. Federal Census collection, over 20,000 family and local history books, an index to nearly 2 million magazine articles with genealogical information, or a vast database of Revolutionary War era records. 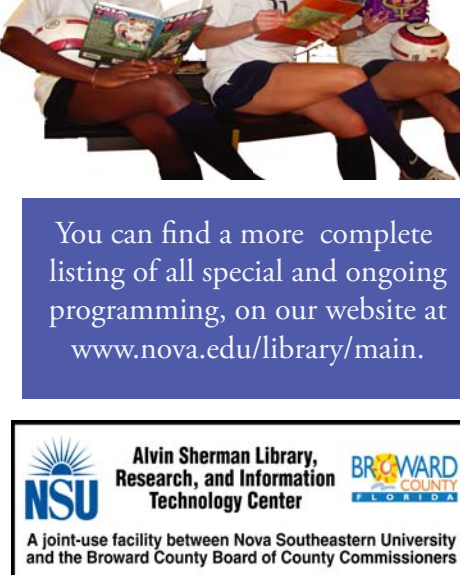
