Philosopher's Index

Provides citations and abstracts covering scholarly research in all areas of philosophy. The literature covered goes back to 1940 and includes articles from over 550 journals, books, book chapters such as contributions to an anthology, and book reviews.

Religion and Philosophy Database

Provides indexing and abstracts to 250 journals on religion and philosophy. Includes selected full-text.

ProQuest Religion

Provides details on doctrines and philosophies, reports on religious history, and related archeology. ProQuest Religion also covers formal theological studies and commentary on topics of general interest from the perspectives of specific religions. Primary faiths represented in the database are Christianity, Islam, Judaism, and Buddhism.

Arts & Humanities Citation Index

Provides abstracts, cited references, times cited, and links to full text when available for articles in the arts and humanities (1975 to present). Part of Web of Knowledge.

World Literature Online

Collection of databases containing literature and primary texts in postcolonial, black, gender, and regional literatures. It contains more than 5,500 plays and more than 250,000 pages of poetry, fiction, and essays from Africa and its Diaspora, Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia, and other regions.

Credo Reference

E-Book database Full text for over 250 reference books covering art, biography, business, conversions, dictionaries, encyclopedias, food, geography, history, language, law, literature, medicine, music, philosophy, psychology, quotations, religion, science, social sciences, and technology.

Oxford Scholarship Online

E-Book database Full text of over 1200 Oxford books in Political Science, Economics and Finance, Philosophy, and Religion.
