

**Nova Southeastern University**

**Highlights-FY 2004-2005**

A total of **\$34,093,380** in sponsored funding for research, community service, and teaching/training activities was received in FY04/05

The FY04/05 total represents a **91% increase** in sponsored funding since FY 99/00.

The FY04/05 total represents a **9% increase** in sponsored funding over the previous fiscal year 2003/04.

Of the FY04/05 total, **58% or \$19,856,163, is to support research.**

Of the FY04/05 total, **39% or \$13,257,734, is funded by the federal government.**

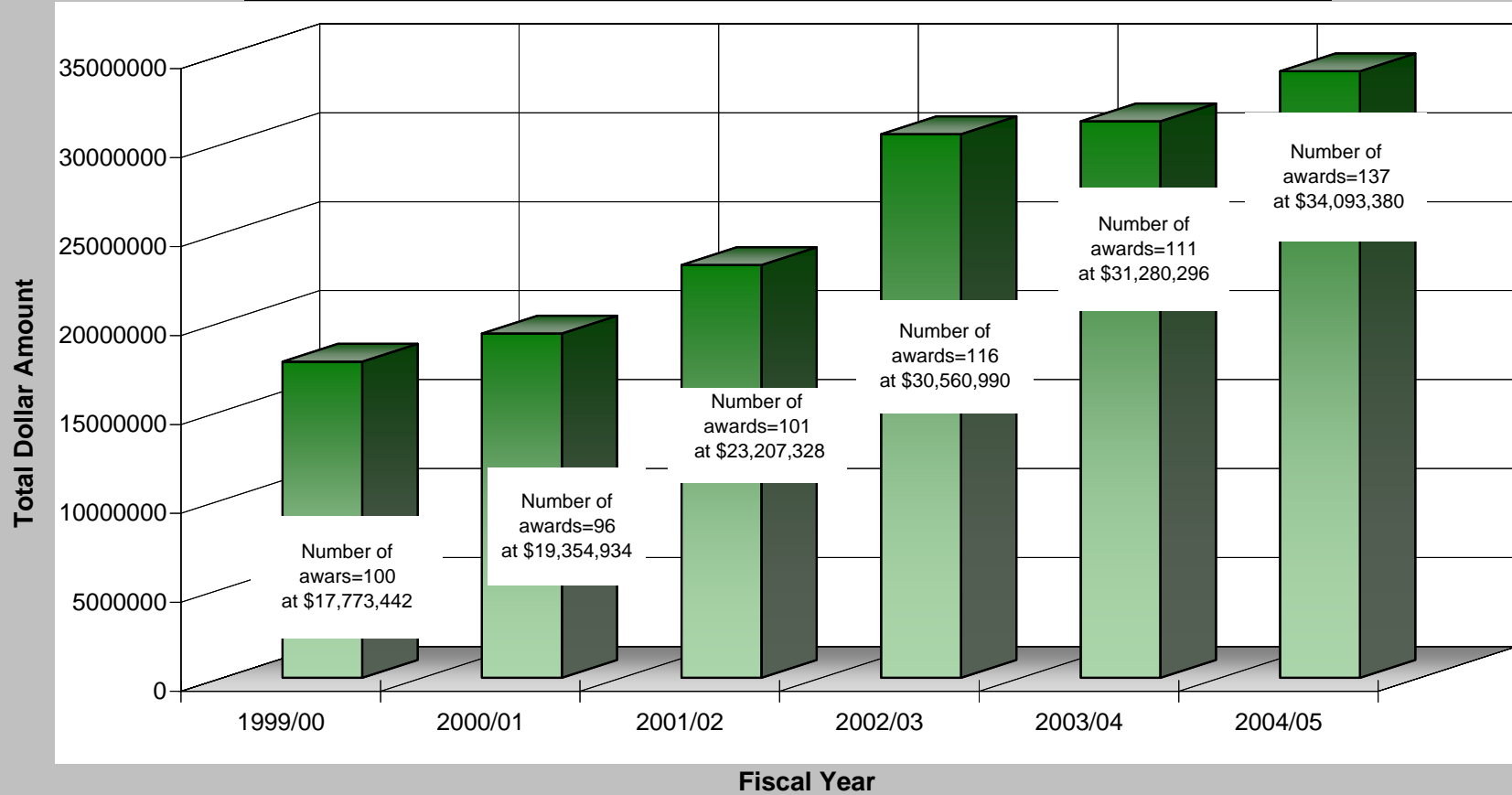
Of the FY04/05 total, 41% is funding to the Oceanographic Center, 29% is funding to the Health Professions Division, and 14% is funding to the Mailman Segal Institute for Early Childhood Studies.

A total of **168 proposals** were processed through the Office of Grants and Contracts during FY04/05, with the largest number, 42, submitted by the Oceanographic Center, followed by the College of Osteopathic Medicine with 22, the Mailman Segal Institute with 20, and the College of Dental Medicine with 19.

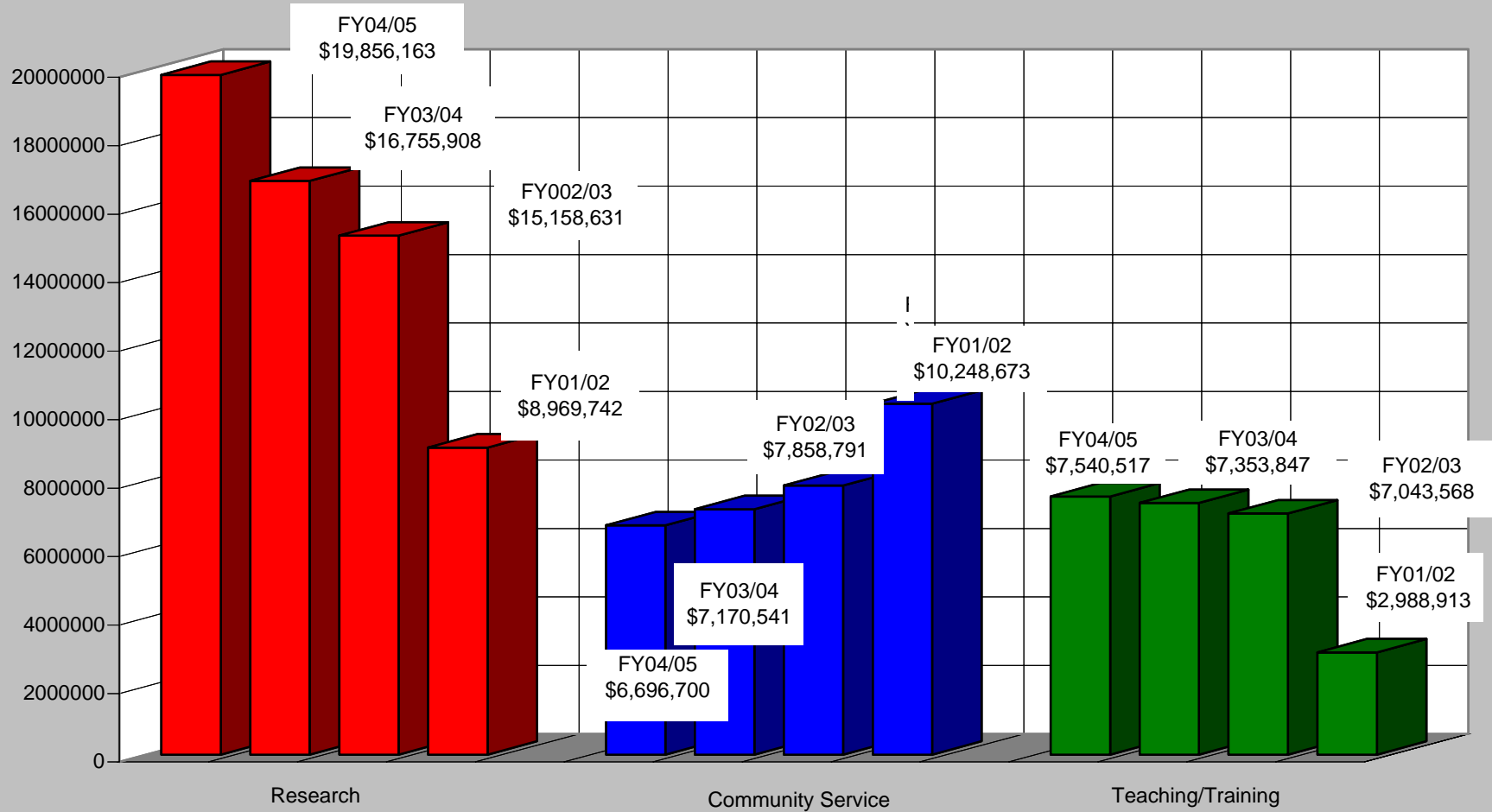
Over the last three years, there has been an 18% growth in the Expedited Review of research.

Effective February 2005, the university implemented the Cooperative IRB Training Initiative (CITI) which is required of all researchers (principal investigators/co-investigators) at the time of new IRB submission, continuation of previously approved research, or revision of previously approved research. As of February **approximately 2600 individuals had completed the CITI program.**

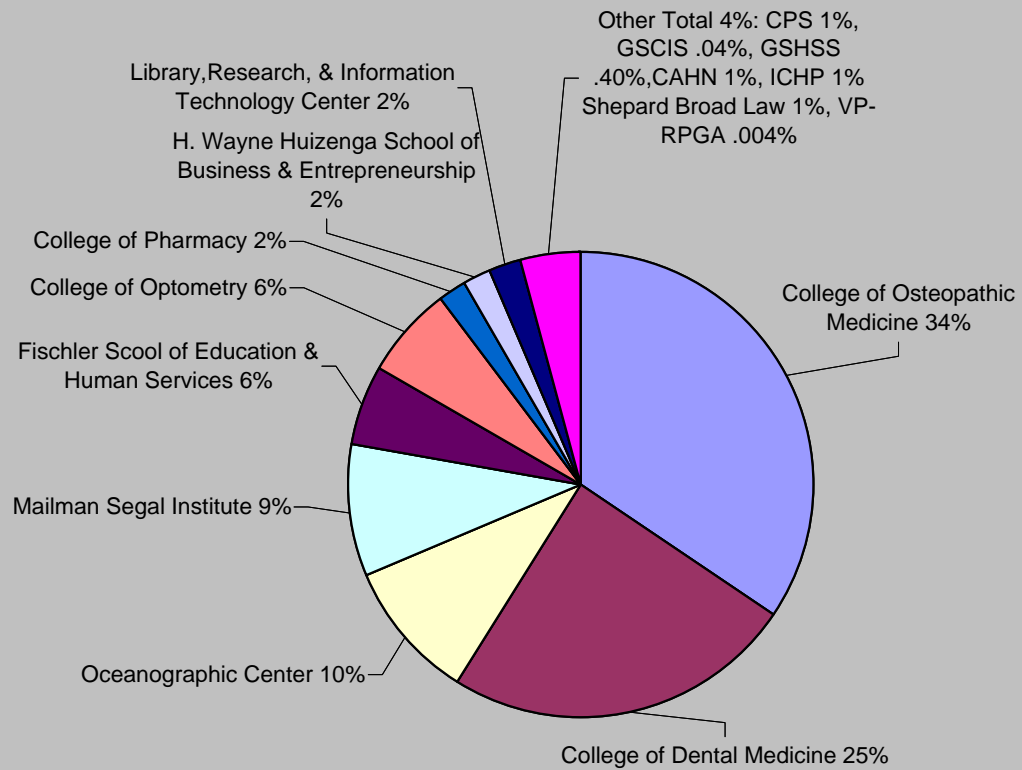
# University-Wide Sponsored Funding FYs 1999/00 Through 2004/05



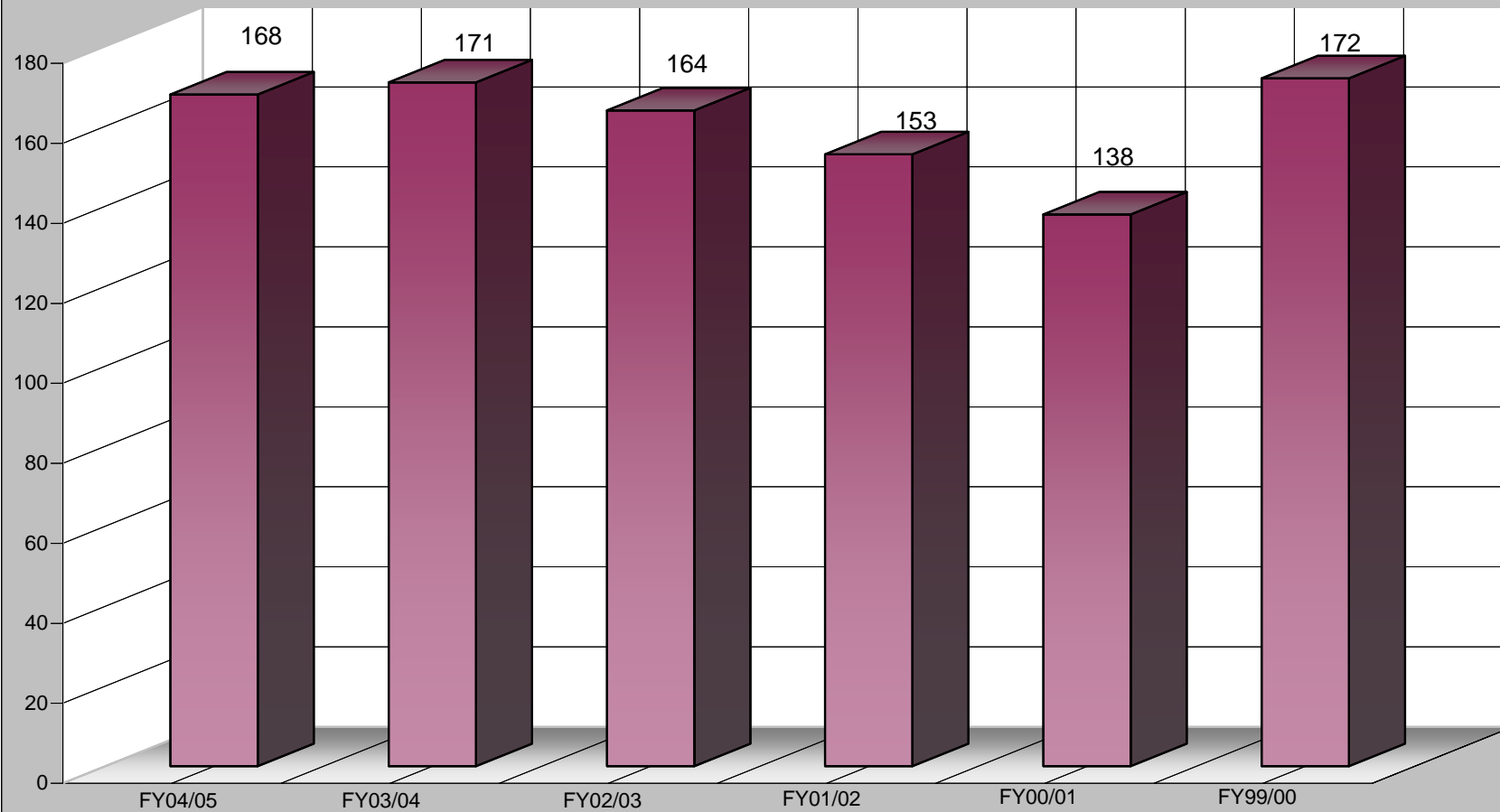

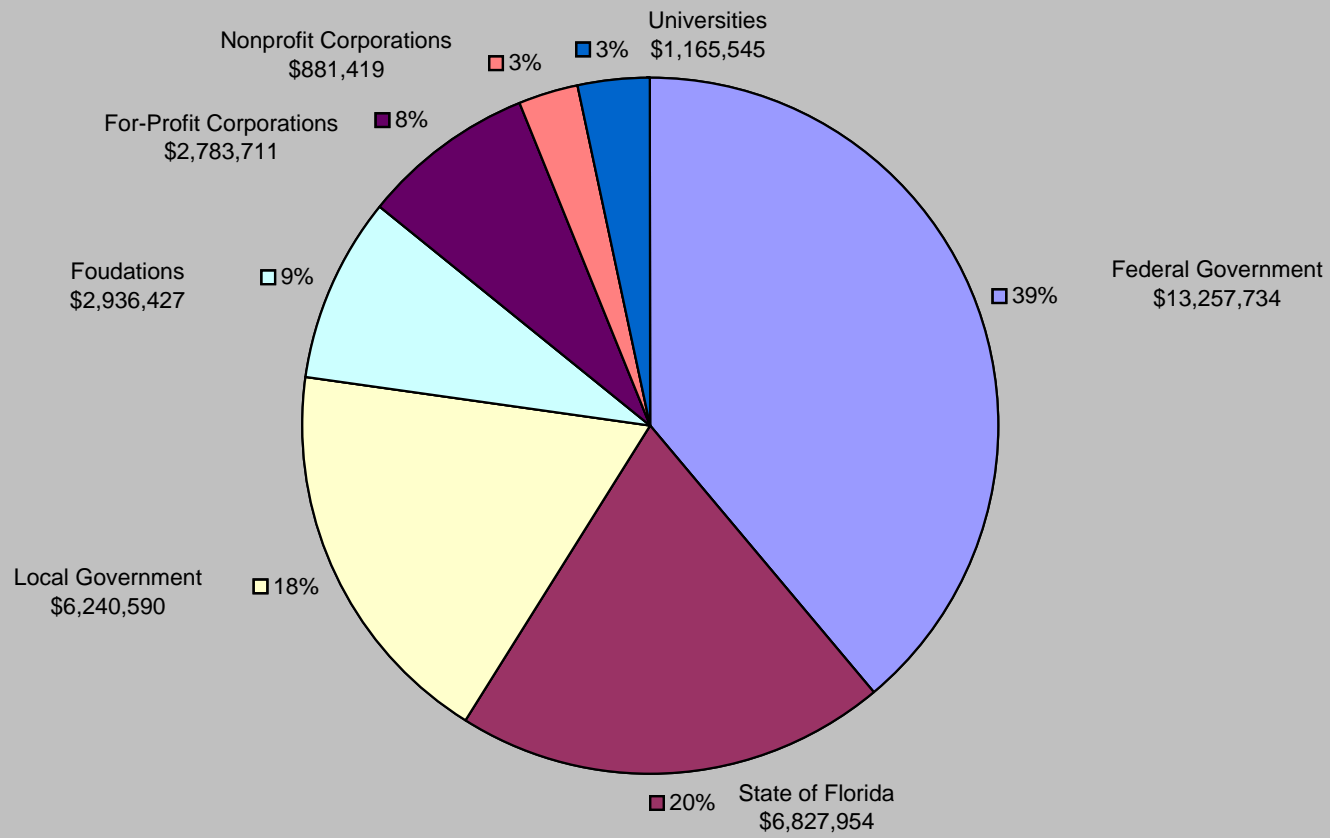
**Proposals Submitted by Division/College/Center Fiscal Year 2004-05**



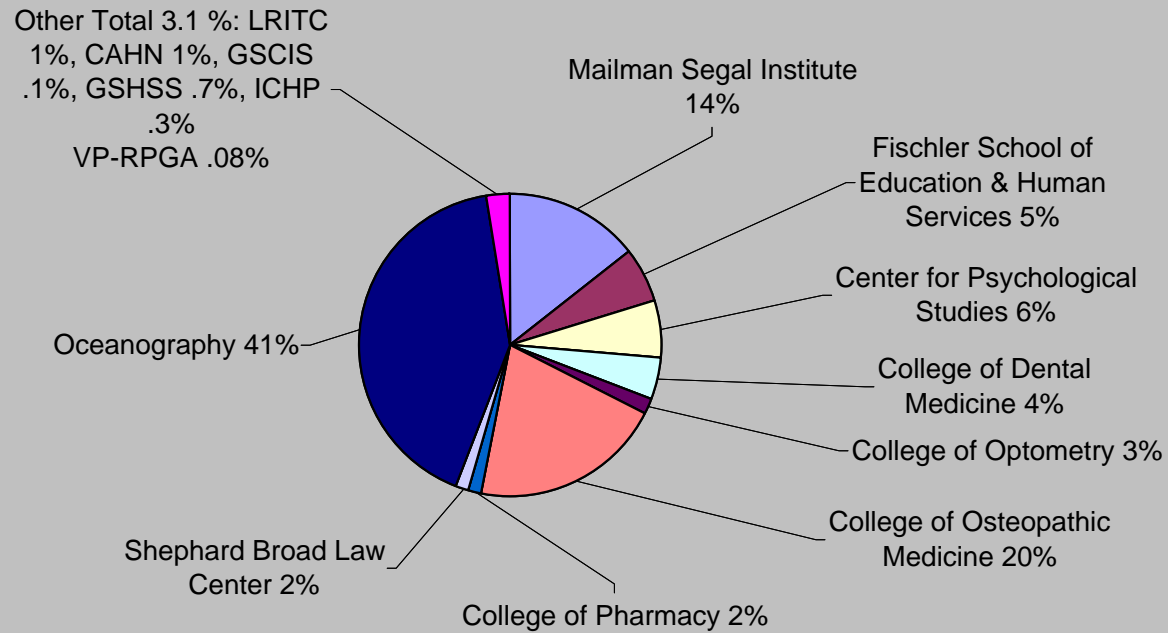
**Proposals Submitted by Fiscal Year**
