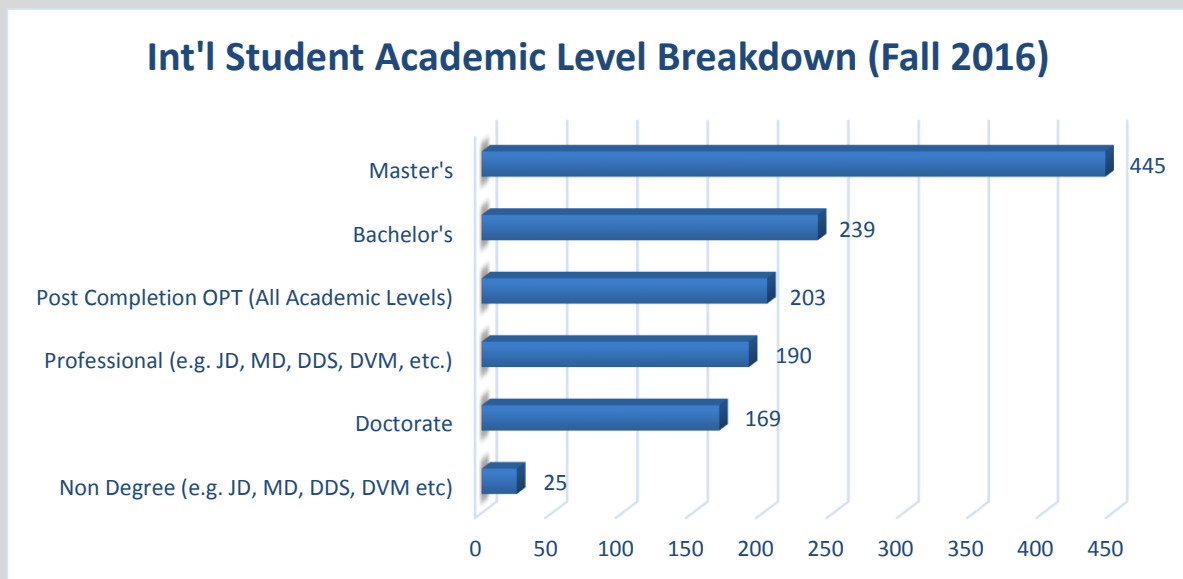
### International Student Breakdown

The International Student population at Nova Southeastern University as of the Fall 2016 Term was 1271 Students representing 109 different countries. This includes all International Students holding an F1 Visa that were enrolled in classes as of the Fall Term or were on Post Completion Optional Practical Training (OPT).

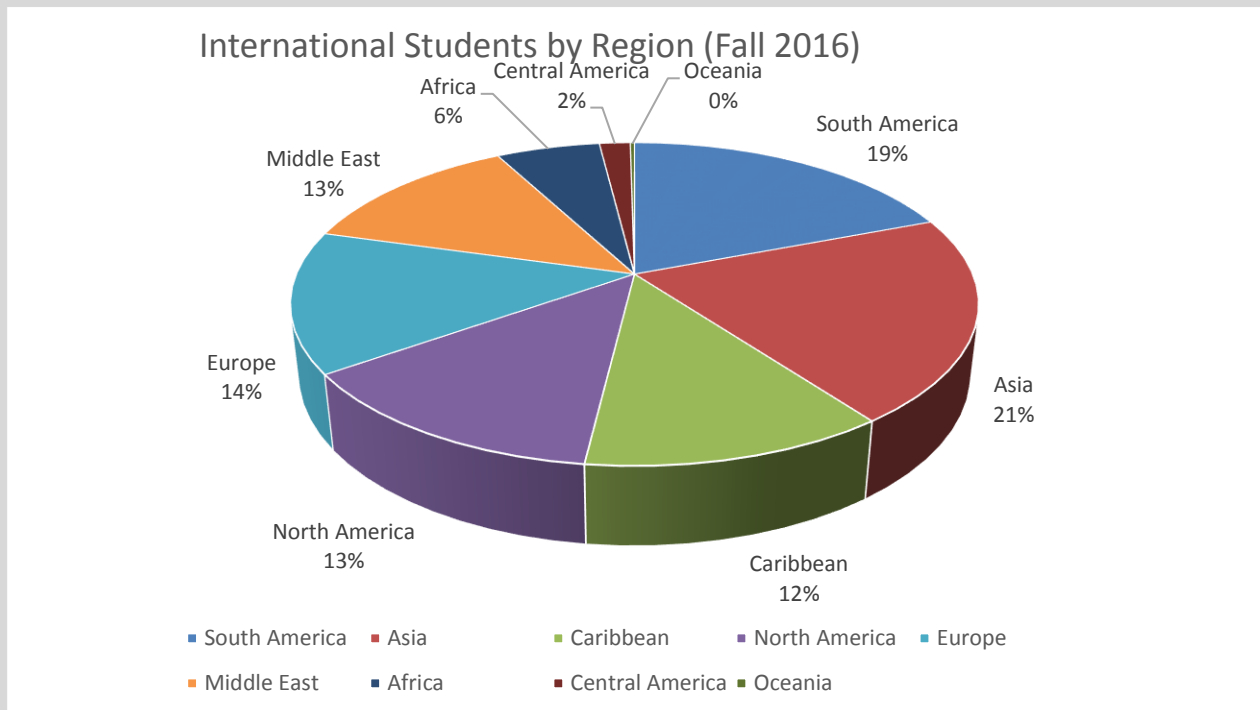
## Origin/Citizenship of International Student Population:

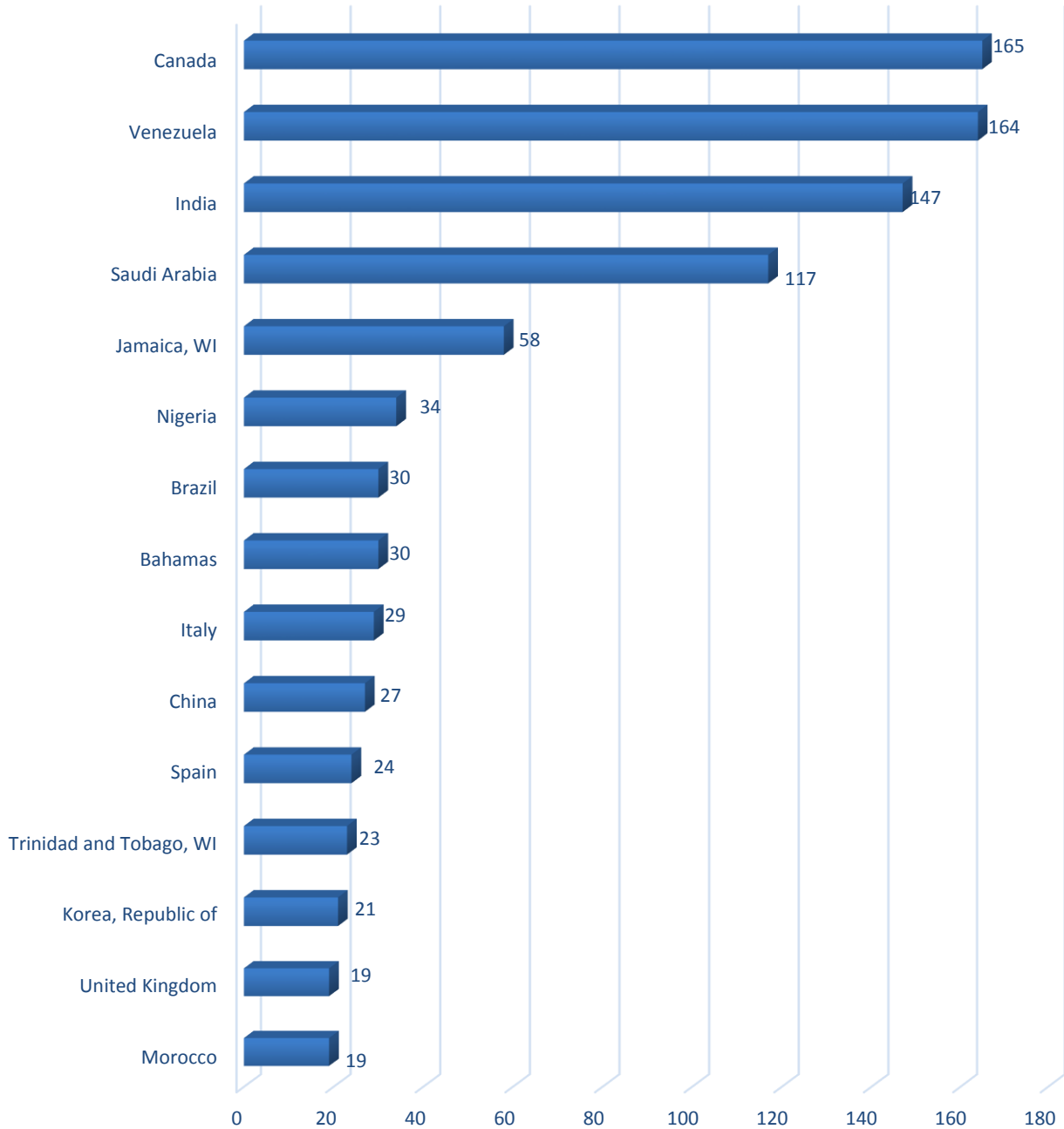

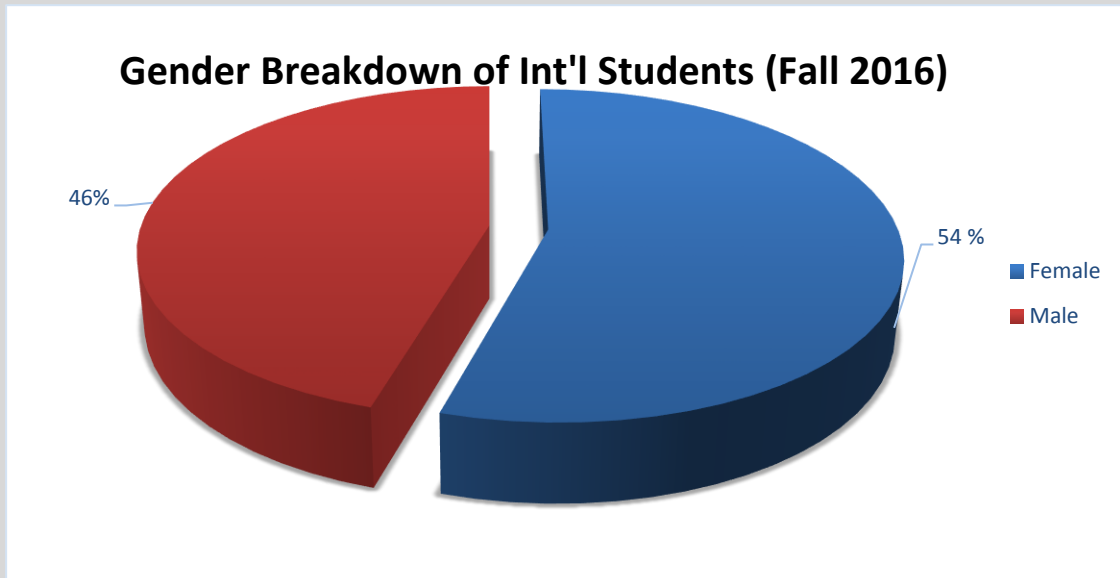

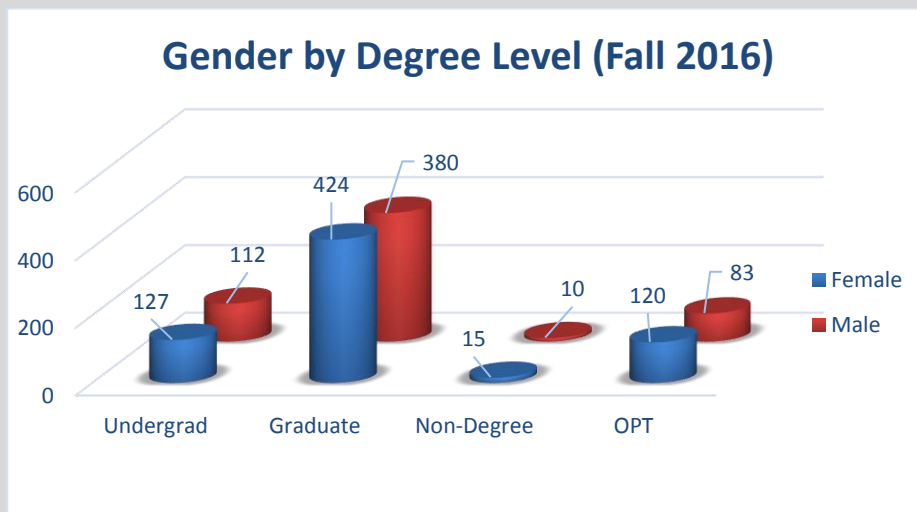
## Gender Breakdown of International Students for Fall 2016:

Within the International Student population, there are slightly more Female than Male Students. The breakdown is approximately 55% Female (686 Students) versus 45% Male (585 Students).



The Gender breakdown differs at each different Educational level. While Male Students outnumber Females at the Undergraduate level, Females outnumber Males at every other level:

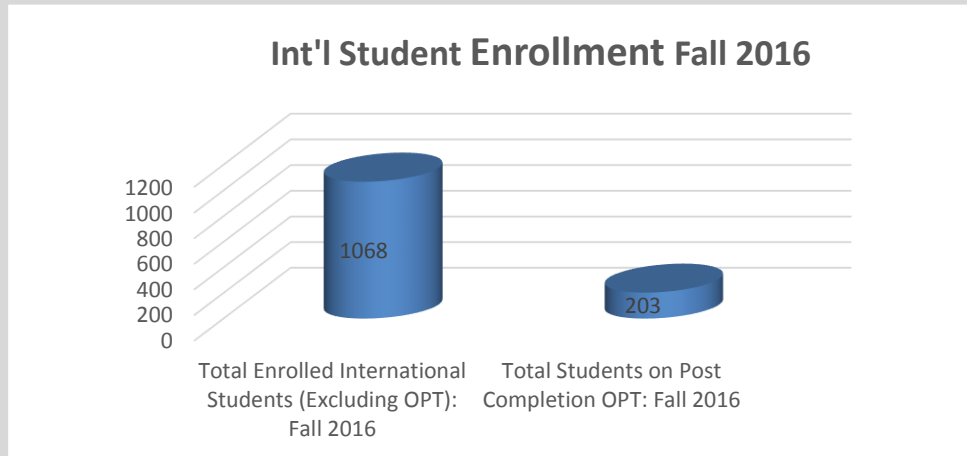

### The Breakdown of Enrolled Students vs. OPT Students:

In the Fall of 2016 there were 1068 Students Enrolled as Active Students. There were 203 Students that were on Post Completion Optional Practical Training (OPT) during the Fall 2016 Term.

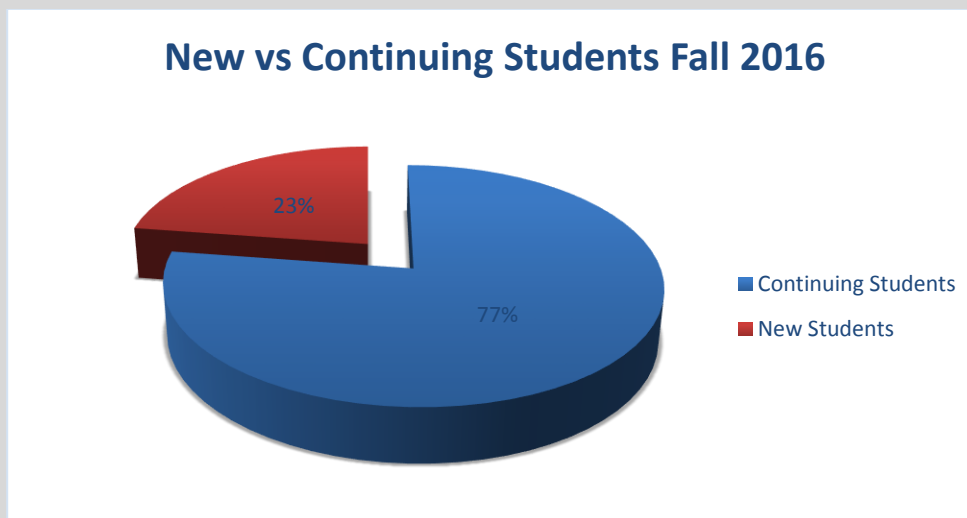
OPT Students are Students who have completed their program at Nova Southeastern University and are legally working for one year in the United States in their field of Study.



### New vs. Continuing International Students:

There were 288 New International Students (first term at Nova Southeastern) and 983 continuing (or returning) International Students.

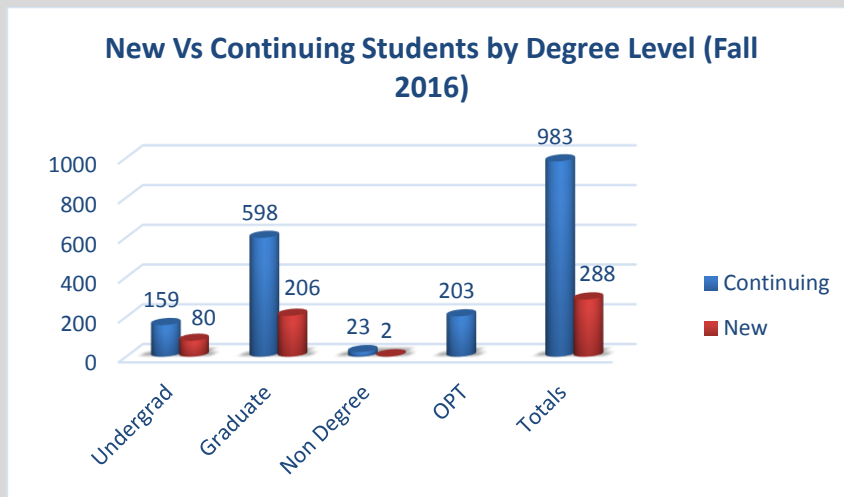
New International Students constituted 23% of all International Students, while Continuing Students represented 77% of the total.
