

Project RISE: Onsite Training Policy

Project RISE provides trainings to all Youth Development programs funded by The Children's Trust (Trust). Trainings are provided in-person, online, and onsite. The majority of RISE trainings occur in face-to-face format at NSU campuses throughout the county. Online trainings are available to all staff in a variety of areas, including behavior management, homework assistance, effective literacy instruction, and more.

Limited-availability onsite trainings for specific trainings* are provided if agencies meet the following criteria:

- A minimum 10 confirmed staff to participate in the training.
 - Project RISE will announce the training to all Youth Development providers. If a minimum is of 15 participants have not registered by one week prior to the training, the event is subject to cancellation.
- Adequate space to accommodate up to 30 people (e.g., seating, tables, etc.)
- The request must be made at least six weeks in advance.
- Individual providers that do not meet these criteria are welcome to join with other Trust-funded providers so that they can meet the criteria and schedule a training.

Availability of onsite training is limited by staff availability. Project RISE will make every effort to accommodate requests for onsite training that meet the above criteria, but cannot guarantee them.
