Additional Training Information

Fitness Outcome Assessment: PACER

Youth programs that effectively incorporate physical activity ensure that children are learning habits that contribute to a healthy future. The Progressive Aerobic Cardiovascular Endurance Run (PACER) is a simple and fun way to measure endurance and overall fitness. In this workshop, you will learn how to administer and score this outcome measure to determine physical fitness. The workshop ensures proficiency in PACER assessment administration.

Recertification: If you attended and passed the PACER training within the past 12 months, the PACER Recertification is offered online to those who are eligible.

Audience: Staff member responsible for administering the PACER assessment * **Required Training**

Literacy Outcome Assessment: Oral Reading Fluency (ORF)

Literacy is critical to academic success and youth programs to identify and support children's reading abilities. In this workshop, you will learn how to administer and score the ORF literacy assessment to determine reading fluency. The workshop ensures proficiency in ORF assessment administration.

Recertification: If you attended and passed the ORF training within the past 12 months, the ORF Recertification is offered online to those who are eligible.

Pre-requisite: Prior to enrolling in this workshop or an ORF recertification, participants must complete and pass the brief **Literacy Outcome Assessment: MAZE** online course.

Audience: Staff member responsible for iSTEEP ORF and iSTEEP MAZE testing * **Required Training**

Effective Literacy Instruction Peer-Learning Workshop

This workshop is designed to allow participants to practice applying the skills taught in the online pre-requisite, including evidence-based strategies to improve reading skills (e.g., scaffolding), instruction techniques, and ways to increase youth engagement. Participants will earn a higher level certificate and additional training hours in this topic area.

All teachers responsible for literacy must attend the Differentiated Literacy Instruction training to meet the Trust requirement.

Pre-requisite: Prior to enrolling in this workshop, participants must complete and pass **Effective Literacy Instruction** online course.

Audience: Youth workers who are involved in the direct delivery of reading activities under the supervision of a Certified Teacher.

Differentiated Literacy Instruction

Students learn to read in different ways and youth programs are a great place to offer different ways to learn. Participants will learn how to use reading assessment data (from the ORF and Maze assessments) to identify struggling readers and to develop reading intervention plans unique to each student. This training is specifically designed for Certified Teachers charged with the responsibility of supervising or directly providing after-school reading activities.

Additional Training Information

Eligibility: Miami Dade County Public School Reading Coach, Reading Specialist or Certified Teacher who delivers reading instruction during the school day. Project RISE will need to verify that one of the eligibility criteria has been met to enroll in this course.

Each program site must have designated staff attend each course within the LIT series. Effective Literacy Instruction training meets the requirement for youth workers who are involved in the direct delivery of reading activities under the supervision of a Certified Teacher. All teachers responsible for literacy must attend the Differentiated Literacy Instruction training to meet the Trust requirement.

Recertification: If you attended and passed this training within the past 24 months, a recertification course is offered online to those who are eligible.

Audience: Certified Teachers charged with the responsibility of supervising or directly providing after-school reading activities. * **Required Training**

Effective Behavior Management: Peer-Learning Workshop

This workshop is designed to allow participants to practice applying the skills taught in the online pre-requisite, including behavior management strategies that can help your program avoid common problems (e.g., giving instructions), and ways to use positive reinforcement. Participants will earn a higher level certificate and additional training hours in this topic area.

Audience: Program directors; Youth-Workers; Teachers

Effective Behavior Management: Challenging Behaviors

Managing troubling behavior of children in your program is essential to ensure that your program runs smoothly. This workshop expands upon the prevention skills taught in the Introduction to Effective Behavior Management training by teaching additional effective strategies for reducing behavioral disruptions in your program. In this workshop, participants will learn effective behavioral approaches such as reprimands, response cost, time-out, and overcorrection.

Audience: Program directors; Youth-Workers; Teachers

Youth Enrichment: Active Learning

Older youth need opportunities to actively process, rather than passively receive, information; in other words, they need to engage in active learning. In this interactive, skill-building workshop, participants will experience active learning firsthand and learn six strategies to support active learning in youth, such as providing stimulating activities and engineering success while allowing for mistakes. By the end of the workshop, participants will incorporate these six elements into a lesson plan that they can bring back to their programs. All of the skills learned in this workshop are also found in the YPQA's Supportive Environment Domain and will help programs improve in the areas of Active Engagement, Skill-Building, and Encouragement.

Audience: Providers serving youth in 6th -12th grade

Additional Training Information

Youth Enrichment: Ask-Listen-Encourage

Older youth need to believe that staff listen to them and genuinely care about what they think. Come to our "Ask-Listen-Encourage" workshop in which participants will learn how to ask effective questions, use active listening strategies, and offer effective, encouraging responses to youth. All of the skills discussed in this workshop will also help programs improve in the "open-ended questions" and "non-evaluative language" items found in the Encouragement scale under YPQA's Supportive Environment Domain.

Audience: Providers serving youth in 6th -12th grade

Youth Enrichment: Cooperative Learning

Older youth need opportunities to work together, teach others, and learn from each other. Cooperative learning is an excellent way to nurture youth leadership, build community, and keep things fun. In this interactive, skill-building workshop, participants will be equipped with grouping strategies and ways to build cooperative learning into any program offering. All of the skills learned in this workshop are also found in the YPQA's Interaction Domain and will help programs improve in the area of Collaboration.
