

## TIMELY WARNING: NSU MIAMI CAMPUS Indecent Exposure Reported (1-28-16)

This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Clery Act requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about crime on and near their respective campuses, including timely warnings of crimes that may represent a threat to the safety of students or employees.

Miami- Dade Police and Nova Southeastern University Public Safety are investigating a reported indecent exposure incident occurring at a parking lot adjacent with the NSU Miami Campus main building at approximately 1:00 PM The suspect described as a Latino male in his late 20's-to-early 30's drove past the female reporting party and exposed himself. The reporting person left the scene without further incident. The suspect's vehicle is described as a white Dodge vehicle with red markings on the rear of the vehicle. The suspect was described as wearing shorts and a T-Shirt.

Anyone with information which might aid in the investigation should call 9-1-1 or call Crime Stoppers at 305-471-TIPS (8477). Calls to Crime Stoppers are confidential and anonymous, and the caller may be eligible for a cash reward for information that leads to an arrest.

The following personal safety strategies are recommended for anyone, regardless of when and where they may travel in the area:

Stay alert to your surrounding and nearby persons. If You See Something, Say Something. Maintain your personal safety. Don't do anything that could antagonize or encourage the exposer.

Try to get a description of the offender and their vehicle and license plate. Getting the license-plate number of the car is helpful, but victims should not attempt this if it will jeopardize their safety.

Call 9-1-1 and report the crime as soon as possible.
