- Even if you are only leaving your bike for a short period of time, make sure it is secured.
- When you are away from home, secure your motorcycle while it is parked by locking several bikes together or to a secure object that cannot be dismantled.
- Use multiple locks such as fork, disc and ignition.
- Use disc locks with a large bright colored tag to remind you of the lock and to make the lock more visible to thieves.
- Lock the front forks on the motorcycle.
- Lock your ignition.
- After you have parked your bike, continue to check on it by looking back as often as
 possible when leaving the area.
- Do not store your title on the motorcycle.
- Keep your registration and insurance card on your person so that if your bike is stolen, you are able to more quickly verify motorcycle ownership and have the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) number handy for law enforcement.
