



TIMELY WARNING: AUTO THEFT

This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. INCIDENT: A non-affiliated patron delayed reported that their vehicle was stolen from the north parking lot of the Orlando Regional Campus. The vehicle owner is an employee of a neighboring business. The Orlando Police Department and the NSU Public Safety Department are investigating this crime.

CRIME PREVENTION: HOW TO PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE

Many auto thefts are crimes of opportunity. Leaving the keys in your vehicle (even a “hidden” spare key) greatly increases your chance of having your vehicle stolen.

- Don't leave your keys in your vehicle.
- Close your windows and lock your doors whenever you leave your car, regardless of how long you plan to be gone.
- Park in well-lit areas.
- Park in lots that have attendants.
- When parking your car, turn your wheels toward the curb to make it more difficult for a thief to “tow” your car.
