

TIMELY WARNING: ATTEMPTED KIDNAPPING

This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Clery Act requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about reported crimes on and near their respective campuses, including timely warnings of crimes that may represent a threat to the safety of students or employees.

Incident Location: 3600 Block of College Avenue (across the street from Goodwin Residence Hall)

Date & Time Occurred: Monday, 09-25-17 at approximately 10:00PM

Date & Time Reported to Public Safety: Monday, 09-25-17 at 10:35PM

INCIDENT: An NSU Resident student reported that while she was walking southbound on the east side of College Avenue a black four door sedan (unknown make/model/year) traveling north bound approached her. One of three males inside vehicle began talking to her and then exited vehicle and continued talking to her while he approached and then put his hand around her arm. NSU student refused suspect's request to get into the vehicle and broke his grip, whereupon the suspect pushed her to the ground. The NSU Resident describes the suspect as: 6 ft. tall white male with a tan complexion, black hair wearing a black shirt, thin build and approximately 20 years old. CRIME PREVENTION: HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- When possible, avoid walking alone. Walk with a friend or walk in well-traveled and well-lit areas.
- Avoid places where you are vulnerable and there are no exits.
- Be aware of people around you. When you are walking, stay alert and tuned into your surroundings.
- Walk with confidence; show that you are aware and in control.
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest business or residence for help.
- If you are harassed by the occupants of a car, turn and walk in the other direction. The driver will have to turn around to follow you.
