COURSEWORK TRANSFER

The easiest way to view equivalencies for courses from many institutions across the United States and select foreign institutions is to check out the Transfer Credit System on our website at *nova.edu/tes*.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Nova Southeastern University (NSU) will transfer a maximum of 90 degree-applicable credits toward a degree, including credit for the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), proficiency exams, prior experiential learning, and dualenrollment college-level credits.

NSU will transfer courses for which a student has earned a grade of *C* or higher. Remaining credits, and at least 50 percent of credits in the student's major, must be earned at NSU in regular academic offerings.

To view equivalencies for courses taken at other institutions, access the online Transfer Credit System available at *nova.edu/tes*.

Credits will be transferred based upon receipt of official and/or unofficial transcripts with at least a provisional admit status to the university. Transfer students must provide final official transcripts from all previously attended colleges for full admit status.

Students will be advised to take courses at NSU based on the completed transfer evaluation.

Transfer students who have earned an Associate of Arts degree or 60 credits as of 1992 from a Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC)-accredited institution and are in good academic standing, as defined by the transfer institution, shall be admitted to NSU with junior standing.

PRIOR EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Use your past achievements to help design your future by earning college credit for skills and training you already possess.

NSU is committed to serving undergraduate students who possess skills and training acquired through an experiential learning background.

Colleges use a variety of systems to gauge student knowledge. The system utilized by NSU is called prior learning. This is a comprehensive procedure for assessing prior college-level learning for undergraduate students. The purpose of this assessment is to award college credit for learning experiences that are judged appropriate by faculty members and other professional evaluators.

Students must initiate prior-learning requests, including examination for credit, prior to completing 24 credits at NSU. Approved prior-learning credits will be reflected on the student's academic record.

FOREIGN CREDENTIALS

Courses completed at foreign institutions must be evaluated and translated to English by a National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES)-approved agency. A listing of NACES-approved evaluation agencies is available at *naces.org*. A course-by-course evaluation with grade point average is required.
