Testing Services News

Testing Services completed its second administration of the LSAT in NSU’s Shepard Broad Law Center with record-breaking attendance. February’s LSAT will be the third test hosted by NSU, and it is filling up fast.

November’s Mock MCAT was filled to capacity, and the participants who are interested in going to medical school were thankful for this opportunity to get a feel for what the real MCAT will be like.

Testing Services is planning to offer this mock test every November. If you missed this chance, look for signs in the fall or stop by OAS Testing Services to ask about it. Students get the chance to take one of the retired MCAT exams in a simulated test setting, and the institutional rate is passed on to the student. This covers the cost of the exam itself, and you get an entire year of access to the AAMC website and all of their resources to assist in study preparations for the real thing!
